## **ORDINANCE NO. 2014-257**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SAC CITY, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO SECTION 136.03, THE REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE, AND ACCUMULATIONS OF CHAPTER 136, SIDEWALK REGULATIONS

**BE IT ENACTED** by the City Council of the City of Sac City, Iowa, that:

**SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED.** Section 136.03 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Sac City, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

**136.03 REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE, AND ACCUMULATIONS.** It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to remove snow, ice, and accumulations promptly from sidewalks. If a property owner does not remove snow, ice, or accumulations within 24 hours after the snow event, the abutting property owner may be liable for damages caused by the failure of said owner to use reasonable care in the removal of the snow, ice, or accumulations. No notice to abate is required. Further, the City may remove the ice, snow, or accumulations and assess the costs in the amount of not less than \$25.00 against the abutting property owner for collection in the same manner as a property tax.

**SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.** If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

**SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
